Standard 4: Coordination of Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) Programs	Provide evidence of assessment during field experiences.	Candidates complete the Exit Evaluation of Objectives Form. The mentor teacher verifies that the candidate conducted five successful SAE visits, supervised both entrepreneurial and placement SAE’s. The visits are documented and described on the candidates’ weekly reports that are submitted to the university supervisor/coach and mentor teacher. Candidates are instructed to make the first one or two SAE visits with their mentor teacher to allow the mentor teacher to demonstrate and/or assist candidates in making quality SAE visits. During the AGRI 280 Seminars candidates are required to report on their progress in completing the competencies on the checklist and to describe their progress in the areas of classroom/laboratory instruction, FFA advising, and SAE supervision. Candidates and

		<p>university supervisors/coaches collectively work to ensure all candidates successfully complete the checklist items. Depending on the time of the year, university supervisors/coaches observe candidates working with students and their projects at fairs and other events that involve student projects. University supervisors/coaches also may observe candidates while they make an SAE visit.</p>
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
