Position Summary:

The Department of Counselor Education and Rehabilitation in the Kremen School of Education and Human Development at California State University, Fresno seeks applicants for a tenure-track, academic year position as an Assistant Professor in Counselor Education with a focus on preparing graduate students for a Master of Science degree in Counseling with an emphasis in School Counseling. The successful candidate will teach and advise students pursuing their master's degree in the Department of Counselor Education and Rehabilitation, supervise students' practicum and internship experiences, conduct scholarly and applied research, and engage in service-related activities.

Overview:

Fresno State has a strong history of service and preparation of education and counseling professionals, celebrating 100 years in 2011. The Kremen School of Education and Human Development has been nationally accredited (NCATE) since 1954 offering 34 distinct credentials, many Masters' degree programs, and a Doctorate in Educational Leadership. The Counselor Education Program at Fresno State includes a masters of science degree in counseling with three options in 1) Student Affairs and College Counseling, 2) School Counseling, 3) Marriage, Family and Child Counseling (CACREP accredited) or 4) Clinical Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling. The program also includes the Pupil Personnel Services credential program for students who aspire to work as school counselors in California.

Required Education:

An earned doctorate (Ph.D.) in Counselor Education from a CACREP accredited institution with an emphasis in School Counseling or other closely-related discipline is required; however, applicants nearing completion of the doctorate (ABD) may be considered. For continued employment in the tenure track position, the doctorate must be completed by 12/20/18.

Required Experience:

1) Successful school counseling experience; 2) Ability to demonstrate a commitment to working effectively with faculty, staff, and students from diverse ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Preferred Qualifications:

1) Eligibility for licensure as a professional counselor or related license or PPS credential in the State of California; 2) Successful teaching experience at the undergraduate or graduate level; 3) Ability to demonstrate a commitment to issues of diversity, advocacy, and social justice; 4) Specific interest in teaching and supervising students enrolled in School Counseling program; 5) Evidence of scholarly research and publications; and 6) Active engagement in the profession of School Counseling, Counseling, Counselor Education, (e.g., ACA, ACES, ACPA, NASPA) or other relevant professional organizations.

Application Procedures:

Review of applications will begin on November 7th, 2017, and will continue until the position is filled. To apply, applicants must complete an on-line application at jobs.csufresno.edu and attach the following: 1) a cover letter specifically addressing required education, experience, and preferred qualifications; 2) a curriculum vitae; and 3) a list of three professional references. Finalists will be required to submit three current letters of recommendation and official transcripts.
