School Psychology Practicum and Internship. Scholars in our program are placed in local schools for field experiences. Placements are rotated each semester to assure students have experience at preschool, elementary, and secondary levels. Field experience sites are also selected to ensure ethnic, linguistic, and SES diversity. Planning and coordinating these placements requires close contact with administration and practicing school psychologists. We also work with the local districts through our Advisory Board which is comprised of administrators and lead psychologists from local districts. As program coordinator and internship supervisor I make site visits to schools each semester.
