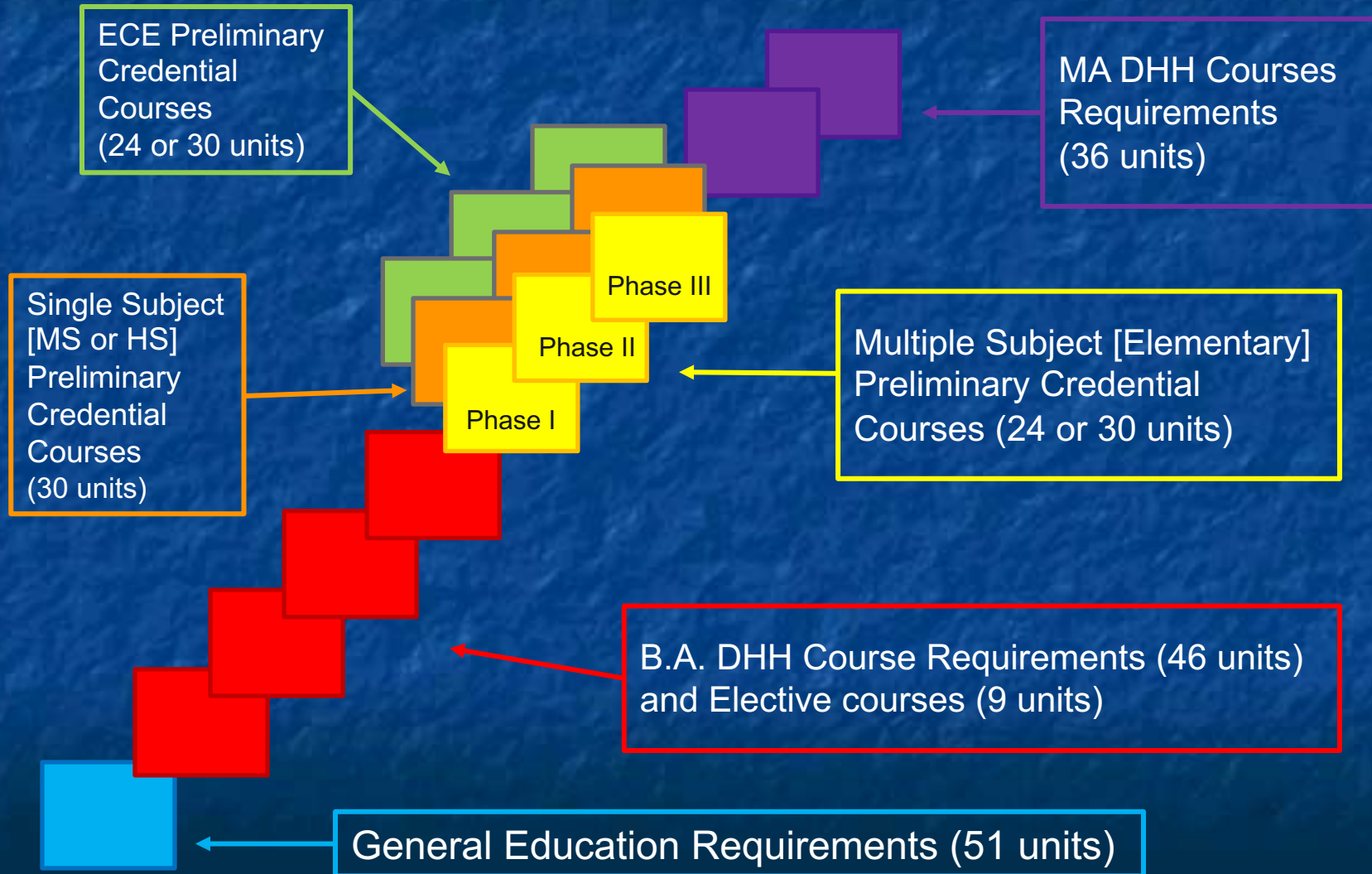

# Deaf Education Graduate Hybrid/Online Courses

- 201 – Interviewing and Counseling in CSDS
- 203 – Graduate Studies and Research in CSDS
- 206 – Audiology for DHH Teachers
- 255 – Assessment of DHH Students
- 260 – Practicum in DHH classroom
- 262 – Speech and Language for DHH Students
- 263 – Language and Instruction for DHH Students
- 264 – Curriculum and Instruction for DHH Students
- 258/268 – Student Teaching (Mainstreamed / Residential Settings)
- 299 – Comprehensive Examination
- And one approved elective course

# Requirements for MA in Deaf Education & DHH Clear Credential

- California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST®)
- California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET®)
- Upper Division Writing Exam (can be replaced with 3 Humanities courses)
- Graduate Record Examination (GRE®)
- Approximately two years of full-time study
- Deaf Education courses (50 units)
- Student Teaching & Internship (16 weeks per semester)
- Culminating Experience: Comprehensive Exam (6 units) OR  
Project/Thesis (6 units)
- Three credential courses (CI 225, CSDS 278 & CSDS 279)

# DEPP Scholarship Opportunities

- MA in Deaf Education
  - For students who are pursuing their MA in Deaf Education only
  - Must have a 3.0 GPA or above
  - About \$4,700 stipend per semester which goes toward tuition, books, dorm fees, etc.
  - Must attend all required courses and conferences as they arise (including 188T)
