- Applicants nearing completion of the doctorate (ABD) may be considered. For an appointment, the doctorate must be completed by the date of appointment (August 1, 2021).

Required Experience:

- Candidates must have a Certificate of Clinical Competence (CCC) from the American Speech-Language Hearing Association (ASHA) and eligibility for California licensure.
- Candidates must demonstrate a commitment to working effectively with faculty, staff, and students from diverse ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds.

- · Clinical expertise in the areas of neurogenic language disorders and/or dysphagia
- A commitment to, or potential for, teaching excellence and scholarly activity at the graduate
 level
- A history of, or potential for, developing grant proposals and attracting external funding
- Active participation or leadership roles in national, state, or local professional organizations
- · Evidence of publication in a scholarly journal
- · Bilingual proficiency
