Department of Counselor Education and Rehabilitation

The Department of Counselor Education and Rehabilitation (CER) houses the Master of Science in Counseling with options in School Counseling and Student Affairs and College Counseling; the Master of Science in Clinical Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling; the Master of Science in Marriage, Family and Child Counseling; and the California Pupil Personnel Services (PPS) credential which aligns with School Counseling and is accredited by the California Commission for Teacher Credentialing (CCTC).

All programs and options successfully underwent accreditation and program reviews during 2019-2020. The Clinical Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling and Marriage, Family and Child Counseling Programs were awarded a 2-year accreditation by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP). The department CACREP liaison and faculty leadership are in the process of engaging university administrators in discussion regarding CACREP report findings with the goal of implementing actions by October 2021 in an effort to secure a full 8-year accreditation status. School Counseling/PPS coordinator and faculty are working to develop curriculum and respond to national accreditation requirements including the shift from 600 to 800 field placement hours, emphasis in social justice advocacy, and development of self-care plans.

The department has 12 full-time tenured/tenure-track faculty, 1 full-time lecturer, 27 temporary faculty, and an average of 400 students enrolled in programming in the department. The department welcomed Dr. Yuleinys Castillo at the start of Fall 2019. A successful faculty search was conducted this academic year which resulted in the hiring of Dr. Ramar Henderson starting in Fall 2020. Two faculty search requests were advanced for the Master of Science in Counseling options in School Counseling and Student Affairs and College Counseling (SACC). It should be noted that while SACC has one faculty member, robust student-faculty research and accolades have been achieved. The department honored full-time lecturer, Dr. Ruth Shaeffer, who is retiring after 24 years of service and student assistant, Rosa Aguayo, who graduated this Spring.

The CER Department evidenced numerous student accomplishments of which selected examples are listed below:


The department is proud that students with faculty support across programs, mentorship, and advising continue to be engaged in scholarly activities at multiple levels.

Despite the difficult year that the CER department has experienced with multiple losses, faculty, staff, and students have evidenced resilience. New community partnerships have been developed. Student-faculty research and mentoring has continued. In fact, one faculty member had five publications. Four department faculty were recognized as part of the Outstanding Faculty Publications virtual exhibit: <u>https://facpub.library.fresnostate.edu/ksoehd</u>

Programs and options conducted cross-collaborative New Student Orientations, Advising Workshops, Certification and Licensing groups, Professional Development and Association Forums, and Exit Orientations. They were cross-collaborative in that faculty and students across programs helped develop the groups, disseminate information, and facilitate delivery.

The CER Department was also very active in the 2019-2020 Kremen School of Education and Human Development (KSOEHD) Open House and Black Family Day sponsored by the Cross Cultural and Gender Center. Under faculty advisor leadership, Chi Sigma Phi Chapter of Chi Sigma Iota inducted new student members and now has 71 active members. Chi Sigma Iota is an international honor society that promotes academic and professional excellence in counseling.

- 1. Graduation Initiative 2025: Graduation Rates, Retention Rates, Closing the Loop
 - The CER Department evidences an increase in applicants. Faculty have engaged in diverse partnerships and advocacy to bolster awareness of academic programs within the department. Given the increase in applicants, admitting once a year, and largely moving to a cohort-based model, the department has admitted 34% of applicants (41% last year) of which 88% of admits (80% last year) have enrolled. Faculty-student ratios are of critical importance to ensure alignment with accreditation standards for high-quality student learning experiences. The department is working with linking students with on and off-campus financial resources as some students have shared concerns in this area and an inability to move forward as initially planned. Another area of focus is strengthening outreach and recruitment to communities of color to strengthen the pipeline of applicants across all groups.



• Enrollment Trends

The CER Department averages 400 students enrolled in programming annually. Eightyseven percent (87%) of students identify as being students of color.

• Retention After 2 Years, Degree Within 3 Years, and Full-Time Student Status Sixty-eight percent (68%) of students are retained after two years. Seventy-two percent (72%) of students finish their master's degrees within 3 years and 98% of students who attend carry full-time student status. These trends are similar to what was seen last academic year. At least two of the programs within the department are 60 units. Many students pursue requirements to become Licensed Marriage Family Therapists and Licensed Professional Clinical Counselors as well as dual certifications as Certified Rehabilitation Counselors, National Certified Counselors, and the Pupil Personnel Services Credential (PPS). As such, students need approximately 3 years to complete their degree and credentials to leverage academic experiences in ways that are meaningful and in alignment with their career trajectories.

Students in the CER Department are doing well academically. There are three undergraduate Coun designated courses in the department. They are required for entry into graduate programs in CER and some students enrolled outside of the department may take them as electives. The rate of DFW grades in these courses is 1%. Though this is low, student success at all levels is key. Instructors are encouraged to continue working proactively with students and reach out early for support to wrap around students who are enrolled in these courses.

- 2. Fundraising
 - The CER Department did not have specific fundraising goals for 2019-2020. However, discussion was undertaken with the intention of examining this area more intently so funds could be raised and subsequently reserved for CER faculty/staff retreats to work on

a strategic plan and supplement student travel and presentation printing costs for local, state, and national conferences. The CER team also discussed the desire to develop a scholarship award at the department level. The Department Chair and one staff member began working with development officers within KSOEHD to identify relationships with existing foundations and potential new relationships that can be explored based on respective missions. Introductions and letters of intent were advanced with various foundations. Work is ongoing in this area. Additional dialogue with KSOEHD development staff and university personnel is scheduled to advance during 2020-2021 with the specific goal of identifying a fundraising portfolio for the department.

3. Workplace Quality Survey

- The Fresno State Open Forum presentation document and the department results were shared with CER stakeholders during department meetings. The Principles of Community were used to guide the discussion of department strengths and opportunities for growth. Some of the most notable themes present as part of the discussion that were transitioned into accomplishments during the 2019-2020 year focused on streamlining processes (e.g., clinical reviews; comprehensive examination; license and credential workshops; advising; etc.), use of department meeting time, faculty hiring needs, inclusivity, and visibility and branding. Department meetings were restructured for essential business and collective items whereas program and option meetings were reserved for day-to-day discussions. Department meetings also included zoom options to afford greater access to all and included dedicated agenda items that recognized team (full/part-time; staff; student assistants) contributions, leadership, and accomplishments. Throughout the academic year, student success groups for advising, professional development, etc. were held using a cross-team collaboration model which also helped to strengthen work relationships and model to students the importance of working towards collective goals. Increased and intentional emphasis on diversity, equity, and inclusion across goals and projects led to faculty collectively prioritizing certain program and option needs relative to hiring requests, accreditation, and program review success, and responding during crises the department faced this academic year.
- The Department Chair met individually with 13 temporary faculty to learn more about their areas of expertise, existing needs, and areas of desired contributions. Meeting invitations will be extended again during 2020-2021.
- The CER Department entered into new community partnerships one of which was facilitated by a temporary-faculty member. The Resiliency Center through the Fresno Police Department Chaplaincy presented at a department meeting that led to future discussions and actions towards student field placement experiences, grants, and research. Given the diverse nature of counseling and rehabilitation professionals being prepared through programming in the CER department, it is important to have community partnerships that all students can access and leverage so they are prepared to be culturally competent and ethical service providers and leaders. As such, the Department Chair has entered into conversations with the Department of Behavioral Health for the purposes of developing partnerships focused on:
 - Engaging in grant development (small, medium, large-scale initiatives) which will support DBH needs, CER department needs, support faculty-student research, etc.

- Developing curriculum (prevention, cultural competence, COVID-19 and specific community impact)
- Supporting students in getting involved with community outreach prior to field placement experiences
- Facilitating town hall meetings, conferences, webinars, think tanks, etc. on issues impacting our community
- 4. COVID-19 Response
 - The CER team was very active in supporting students and one another while also attending to maintenance of community partnerships. Full and part-time faculty shared instructional, wellness, working-at-home, and ergonomic resources with one another. Information being provided at the university and school levels was distributed to the CER team and student body with messages of recognition, hope, and connection. Relative to student success, faculty provided safe spaces to have students process before, after, and outside class in the virtual environment. As some students lost their jobs, faculty made efforts to connect students with agencies that were actively hiring. Faculty were intentional about reminding one another to validate students' experiences given demographics (e.g., working students, student parents, students with disabilities, students of color, etc.). For instance, when the children of student parents wanted to appear on zoom, faculty invited them to do so. They were welcomed to engage (e.g., Hello; How are you; Have a good day). This integration helped to normalize and validate experiences. Many students take back-to-back courses (i.e., 4-7 p.m. and 7-10 p.m.). As such, they were provided with frequent breaks throughout sessions. While on break, students were encouraged to take mental and physical breaks versus trying to check email and do other work. Synchronous and asynchronous instructional options were provided.
 - The CER team also proactively engaged with community partners relative to field experiences. Many students had sites close or shift to telehealth and teleservices. The CER faculty were in communication with all sites for students engaging in field placement experiences as well as with certification and licensing organizations. This was important to be able to further advise and guide students towards meeting requirements and making progress.
 - Faculty and staff attended a myriad of online trainings and webinars (e.g., inclusive pedagogy in an online environment during COVID-19; mental health, student success, and COVID-19; children resources, counseling, and COVID-19; etc.) to stay informed and agile as part of our response to COVID-19.
 - All programs and options offer the comprehensive examination as one of the options for a culminating experience. Through cross-team collaboration and shared leadership, the CER team was able to convert the in-person comprehensive examination to an online process while orienting students to the new procedures, securing faculty volunteers for technological set-up and grading, and maintaining the integrity of the process. Sixty-two (N=62) students underwent the examination in Spring 2020. The Comprehensive Examination Coordinator was available throughout the 5-hour process in case students needed to reach out for support.
 - Faculty have found ways to celebrate students. For example, faculty appeared via zoom in regalia to help celebrate alongside family a student who was graduating. Small gifts are scheduled to be mailed to CER graduates.

• While a university and school level survey was conducted to gauge student experiences during COVID-19 and faculty received data from students during advising, mentoring, and safe spaces in class, the CER Department plans to conduct a formal survey during 2020-2021. Current students and recent graduates will be invited to participate to more fully explore student lived experiences, strategies, and recommendations.

Department of Curriculum and Instruction

During 2019-20, the Department of Curriculum and Instruction (C&I) consisted of 16 outstanding full-time faculty, 46 talented part-time faculty, one very efficient and knowledgeable administrative assistant (recipient of this year's Kremen Extraordinary Staff Award), and 3 dedicated and hard-working student assistants (shared with the LEBSE Department in our office suite).

Faculty in the department provide a wide array of courses (all of the CI courses plus EHD field placement courses) for the Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialist teaching credential programs, as well as for a number of graduate programs in the Kremen School (CI plus ERE courses--research, statistics, and evaluation). Pre-professional program courses for Liberal Studies majors and other prospective teachers are also offered by the C&I Department. As evidenced by the data in the tables below, our full-time faculty members are highly productive and involved in important local, national, and international educational endeavors. They are committed to the highest levels of instruction and to preparing future--and current-teachers for the classrooms of tomorrow. They are critical scholars and strong activists for social justice and the eradication of inequities and racism in schools, local communities, and the world at large. Many actively collaborate with faculty in other departments and IHEs, as well as with local school district educators and administrators.

- 1. Programs and Data
 - The department houses the fully online Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) program, as • well as the Master of Arts in Education, Curriculum and Instruction option (M.A.Ed.-C&I). During 2019-20, 24 students entered the MAT program, and 72 students entered the M.A.Ed.-C&I program. This year, the MAT program underwent a highly successful program review at the university level and also graduated 25 students. The M.A.Ed.-C&I program celebrated its 6th year of partnership with the Fresno Teacher Residency Program, with over 40 FTRPs graduating with both a master's and a teaching credential, nearly two-thirds of this year's 64 M.A.Ed.-C&I program graduates. Discussions will continue regarding program elevation to a stand-alone M.A. in Curriculum and Instruction in response to Chancellor's Office EO 1071 and decisions by other options in the M.A. in Education. In addition to the master's programs, the department also houses the Kremen School's only Certificates of Advanced Study: the popular CAS in Educational Technology and the new CAS in Research Methods. The coordinator of the CASRM received a recruitment grant this year and hopes to grow the numbers in the CASRM during 2020-21.
 - In 2019-20, 202 students were admitted to the Multiple Subject (MS) credential program, 179 to the Single Subject credential program, 58 to the Educational Specialist (SPED) program, and 32 to the Dual (MS+SPED) program, for a total of 471 new credential students served by the C&I Department, in addition to hundreds of graduate students and prospective teaching candidates. Although retention is high in the credential, graduate, and advanced certificate programs, the number of teaching candidates across all programs except for the Dual program dipped this year from the 2018-19 total of 512.

- We hope that enrollment (despite COVID-19) will be robust this coming fall, in part due to our seven new teacher residency programs coming online this year. Most of these exciting partnerships with districts are supported by grant funding from the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. The new residencies (with Spring, Summer, or Fall 2020 start-dates) will join the Multiple and Single Subject evening credential cohorts during Fall 2020. Scheduling for this unprecedented number of cohorts has been challenging but exciting.
- 2. Fundraising
 - Fundraising isn't a primary focus of the department, as funds are generally centrally raised for the benefit of the Kremen School by the Director of Development in partnership with the Dean's Office, which maintains a centralized budget for the Kremen School. Funds raised for the Curriculum and Instruction Department during Fresno State's annual Day of Giving provided support and sustenance for C&I faculty. Indirect funds from faculty grants are a minor source of support for faculty. Some grants include faculty reimbursed release time at full replacement cost (plus benefits).
- 3. Workplace Quality Survey
 - The 2019 Workplace Quality Survey showed that perceptions of communication, collaboration, fairness, respect, and appreciation were relatively low in Kremen and in the C&I Department. The interim dean and interim associate dean, as well as the department chairs tackled these issues in earnest as a team and within their departments this year. Beginning in August 2019, the C&I and LEBSE departments both had new department chairs. Dr. Carol Fry Bohlin (C&I) and Dr. Imelda Basurto (LEBSE) formed a positive and productive professional partnership to collaborate on course scheduling and hiring with a strong focus on implementing university policies with fidelity and fairness. To increase collaboration and communication, Dr. Fry Bohlin also established a Google Drive folder (https://bit.ly/DeptCI) for the C&I Department with subfolders for university documents, Kremen documents, and monthly departmental meeting documents. The latter included detailed meeting agendas with links and references to numerous related documents. Each monthly meeting agenda contains a number of Reminders, Announcements, and Updates/Information (including faculty/staff news and recognitions) along with the New and Unfinished Business agenda items to serve as an informative resource for departmental faculty.  - C&I faculty are actively consulted regarding departmental policies and decisions. This year, for example, the Course Classification System numbers and related normal class size numbers were examined for all CI, EHD, and ERE courses (courses administered by our department). In general, the class caps were found to be higher (in some cases significantly so) than the typical class sizes for their current classification. With support from the provost and dean, chairs were allowed to set class caps at the normal class size numbers for Fall 2020. Discussions with faculty regarding variations in the caps are ongoing and will continue in the fall. The important point is that changes impacting faculty are made after consultation and thoughtful deliberation in a spirit of collegiality, professionalism, fairness, and respect.

4. COVID-19

- During the week of March 16, 2020, all faculty were required to convert all face-to-face classes to a virtual format due to the **COVID-19 global pandemic**. During the incredibly challenging two months that followed, nearly every week was filled with Zoom meetings discussing policy modifications for the campus, school, credential requirements, and much more. The faculty all rose to the occasion to serve our students! C&I Department meetings for April and May 2020 were held via Zoom. For the first time, all C&I Department faculty were invited, including the four dozen part-time faculty, a number of whom were able to attend due to the convenience of virtual attendance, which has helped strengthen the departmental professional community/family. (We plan to continue Zoom meetings next year, whether or not the university operations continue to be online/virtual.) It was fortuitous that the department Google Drive folders had been developed, as they became repositories of documents providing guidance from the state and university for COVID-19, as well as for the usual documents related to the school and department. (On a related note: Each of the four finalists for the Kremen dean position spent all day being interviewed by multiple campus groups via Zoom.)
- Communication to faculty and students was increased as a result of COVID-19, and faculty made many accommodations. Faculty kept abreast of the changing policies regarding CR/NC, Incompletes, and much more. Mathematics and science teaching methods faculty in our department determined what materials their students will need next fall for online instruction (the first time these courses will have been offered online); kits will be compiled and ordered this summer, paid for by the Mathematics and Science Teacher Initiative which the Department Chair directs. In May 2020, the M.A.Ed.-C&I program coordinator mailed gold and silver honor cords with notes to all who graduated with distinction during 2019-20. Hopefully, these will be able to be worn during a face-to-face hooding ceremony in the future!
- The department chair revised the Kremen School's peer evaluation form to include the COVID-19 description paragraph. Faculty who could no longer use their \$1500 travel funds were instead allowed to submit receipts for professional materials. Faculty teaching summer school courses quickly worked to revise their syllabi to convert the entire course from face-to-face to online.
- Faculty who had not previously taken QLT (Quality Learning and Teaching) courses for strengthening online instruction during 2019-20 were encouraged to register for these courses in the summer. The university later generously offered to provide a stipend for participants, making the stipend also available to faculty wanting advanced training in online instruction.
- 5. Searches and Retirements
 - This year, the department welcomed a wonderful math and STEM educator, Dr. Lynette Gúzman, to our faculty family. Dr. Kien Pham (mathematics educator, 1990-2019) fully retired in December 2019; in May, Dr. Jeanie Behrend (mathematics educator, 1997-2020) retired with Emerita status and will FERP in Fall 2020. Two C&I faculty members, Drs. Fry Bohlin and Joe Parks, were elected to serve on the search committee for a new dean of the Kremen School. In addition, Drs. Jeanie Behrend, Susan Tracz, and Masha Yukhymenko served on a departmental search committee for a new research and statistics faculty member. The search was quite successful, identifying two candidates who were

excellent fits for the position, but the week the paperwork to hire was submitted, most searches on the campus were paused (cancelled) due to COVID-19, which was most disappointing, especially considering the relatively low tenure density of our department and the number of faculty on FERP (3). The Department Personnel Committee reviewed the files of 12 temporary faculty members in their third year of three and submitted reports to the dean. They also reviewed the full WPAFs and one probational plan of 6 faculty members. Interfolio was used for the first time this year, greatly facilitating the process of file reviews.

Department of Educational Leadership

GOALS

a. Elevate the Educational Leadership and Administration option (P-12 Pathway and HEAL Pathway) of the Master of Arts in Education to two independent degrees within the Department of Educational Leadership; and work on the development of two new SOAPs in coordination with elevating the Educational Leadership and Administration option (P-12 Pathway and HEAL Pathway) of the Master of Arts in Education to two independent degrees.

HEAL

In 2019-2020, Varaxy Yi, as the incoming coordinator, worked with department chair, Susana Hernández, former HEAL coordinator, to respond to requests for information and revision on documents submitted for the HEAL Pathway elevation. We discussed the elevation in multiple HEAL faculty meetings. We attended the Elevation discussion meeting at the University Graduate Committee were the elevation proposal was eventually approved. We attended meetings with Dr. Jim Marshall to discuss requested revisions and requests for additional information from the Chancellor's Office. Additionally, Varaxy Yi worked with Dr. Hernández to revise the Elevation Proposal. We received notice that our elevation was approved on March 13, 2020.

<u>P-12</u>

Numerous meetings, document creations and submissions have taken place over the past two years in support of elevating the P12 and HEAL into stand-alone master's degrees. During mid-February 2020, Educational Leadership received notification from the Chancellor's office that further information was needed to complete the Elevation process such as a curriculum map that outlined student outcome in alignment to state credential requirements. Further updates, additions and clarifications were submitted to the Chair of Educational Leadership and then submitted to the Dean of the Division of Research and Graduate Studies (DRGS) on February 25th.

- On February 27 Dr. Marshall, through the DRGS office, received notification from the Chancellor's office that all clarification and updated information provided by HEAL & P12 had been accepted. The elevation had been approved and will take effect for new students in the fall of 2020. Further communication from DRGS has been received regarding the current 3 cohorts of students. Students will be given the option as to which degree title they would prefer to have on their diploma. The two options are: 1) Master's in Education, Educational Leadership and Administration option or 2) Master's of Educational Leadership and Administration. Students will have one week to notify their preference to the Kremen Admissions Analyst
- There are now two independent degrees: Masters of Arts in Educational Leadership & Administration with a preliminary administrative services credential and a Master's of Arts in Higher Education Administration & Leadership
- b. P-12 pathway will reexamine existing SOAP to align with new state expectations/standards.
 - Agenda item and discussion during 2019-2020 P-12 task force meetings- reviewed current SOAP gave input. Agreement was reached to select 2-3 outcomes to the new

alignment of CalAPA - cut down previous outcomes. Consider P-12 task force objectives as SOAP outcomes - work we are doing in the special task force groups so we have clear measures and evidence (i.e., aligning course structure etc. to CalAPA assessment and student outcomes). Plan to rewrite SOAP in the beginning of Fall as a subcommittee based on new developments from task force groups and student CalAPA (first consequential year) data. Fall P12 SOAP subcommittee meeting to be scheduled by Sept 2020.

- c. Refine the digital platform for EAD 298, by all faculty advising master's degree Research Projects, and revise the digital platform as appropriate based on feedback at the end of each semester
 - During the year, the focus on the MDRP has been on how to support faculty and students during the MDRP process with monthly discussions regarding progress, barriers, strengths and opportunities for change. Further support has been provided to faculty and students through the use and discussion of common tools used by faculty/students during the MDRP such as: Research Prospectus, CPHS application process, common syllabi and the MDRP rubric. At the end of the semester MDRPs are concluded, dialogue among faculty regarding the use of the documents/tools take place to analyze and update for the next semester of students. A working group exists for further refinement of the documents for the next semester.
- d. Provide yearlong quality support to tenure-track faculty.
 - To build community and opportunities for collaboration, Department held faculty spotlights in department meetings for faculty to share their research expertise and professional experiences.
- e. Develop two digital platforms, one for students and one for faculty, to access all department and program policies, procedures, etc.
 - Currently, the Educational Leadership team uses a shared Google Drive to house items such as: meeting agendas/notes, student handbook, MDRP materials, resources for instruction, common course textbooks, CalAPA documents, orientation/recruiting materials, CTC Program Review and the like.
 - A student handbook has been developed for both programs that describes program policies and procedures and will be made available on program website.
- f. Continue effective recruitment methods that result in high yield and expand and sustain strong district and college/university partnerships.

HEAL

The HEAL Coordinator, has engaged in multiple recruitment efforts in the 2019-2020 academic year. She held an in-person information session for prospective graduate students in February 2020 on campus for 21 attendees. She also collaborated with the Director of the Doctoral Program in Educational Leadership to give recruitment presentations at Reedley College in March 2020. They both also visited Madera Community College in December 2019 to begin to build partnerships with the president of the college. The HEAL coordinator also met weekly with prospective students throughout the year. Additionally, the HEAL

Coordinator has maintained an active twitter account to promote the program, faculty, students, and alumni. She also worked with the communications specialist and the graduate programs specialist to update the program website with targeted information for prospective students. These recruitment efforts yielded 38 applicants, a record number for our program. 22 students accepted their admissions offers and will begin as a cohort in Fall 2020.

<u>P-12</u>

According to a 2017 article in Higher Education by J. Hammond some data-driven strategies to recruit graduate students include: digital recruitments, providing quick and accessible information like the length and outcomes of the program as well as demonstrating value. With these principles in mind the following actions took place over the last year:

- 1) District and on campus student information presentations that were brief and addressed time, money, completion, and new assessment metrics,
- 2) Community presentations that provided program specifics, candidate completion and new assessment metrics,
- 3) Creation of a new, South Valley & Rural Educators Dean's Council to expand program/university footprint and potential partnerships in districts and with community colleges in the southern, eastern and western rural counties of the central valley,
- 4) Creation of a Twitter account, Facebook page and redesigned web pages with specific P12 information that is concise and targeted.

With respect to partnerships this past year a new south valley Dean's Council was created to broaden pre-existing relationships and forge new ones in rural areas. Due to COVID-19 the first meeting did not take place, however, relationships were developed and approximately 25 university, community college and P12 leaders had committed to the meeting out of over 100 individuals contacted.

Fall 2020 Sanger Unified will continue to house a new cohort, and discussions are under way for a new cohort in Spring 2021 in Clovis Unified. Currently, a second cohort in the Visalia area (COS/Fresno State facility) is planned construction to begin fall 2020.

- g. Continue P-12 Academic Task Force cycle of review work: review, revise and create (as needed) competency and foundation course tasks in alignment with recently revised California Administrator Performance Expectations (CAPEs) and the California Administrator Performance Assessment (CalAPA) for a Preliminary Administrative Services Credential Preparation Program
 - The P12 Graduate Group (Academic Task Force-ATF) has had a busy and active year as we worked to implement new CTC regulations with the first group of students involved in the consequential administration of the CalAPA. At this time, 5 out of 6 full time tenured or tenure-track faculty have participated in CalAPA training and/or have become CalAPA assessors through Pearson. CalAPA results from the first two cohorts that began fall 2019 continue to be a 100% passage rate, for those that have submitted, with new results being posted monthly.
 - In September 2019, the P12 Grad Group held a strategic planning session to outline goals for the year, in December, 2019 new Learning Commitments to each other were created, 5 working groups or sub committees convened (candidate applications, online cohort

development, graduate writing competency, CTC Program Review, and PASC ReDesign) and have had ongoing meetings with specific outcomes throughout the 2019-2020 school year. Also, faculty voting on program specifics has been instituted since May 2019 as well as the use of agendas, and minutes while following Roberts Rules of Order.

- h. Regular ongoing analysis of CalAPA reports of student assessment outcomes using collaborative processes.
 - Department Goal H became infused into the P12 Administrative Graduate Group (formerly P12 Task Force) monthly meetings; thus, the Goal H Team members included our entire faculty group. The program coordinator provided all faculty members access to our program reports through the CTC online reporting system. Faculty members individually reviewed pass rate data by program candidate and CalAPA cycle as updates became available from on a quarterly basis from the CTC. The program coordinator provided collaborative reflective and action oriented discussion during monthly graduate group meetings. Outcomes from these discussions included updates to course textbooks, Redesign Taskforce planning considerations, and a collaborative P12 faculty forum facilitated by the coordinator to share best practices in virtual formats during COVID-19.
- i. Graduation Initiative 2025
 - The Department of Educational Leadership does not have any undergraduate student enrollment.
- j. Fundraising
 - The Department of Educational Leadership does not have specific departmental fundraising goals. Members of the Department are part of the KSOEHD Development Committee to advance development efforts from the college. Members of the Department also have served as ambassadors for Day of Giving.
 - Areas of strength included:
 - Professional Development
 - Compensation, benefits, & Work/life balance
 - Supervisors/Department chairs
 - Areas to strengthen or focus
 - Teaching environment
 - Faculty, administration, & staff relations
 - Communication
 - Collaboration
 - Fairness
 - Respect & appreciation
 - CSU Fresno Custom statements

Discussion was guided by the following questions: Think about resources that would help strengthen our department in this core dimension. How can we strengthen this core dimension? What can we do in the next 2 years to address this area? Ideas were generated from this initial discussion and an additional meeting was held in February before COVID19.

k. COVID-19 Response

- Staff: Upon local school closures, arrangement were made with Department Administrative Assistant (DAA) to work remotely. Human resources procedures were followed to ensure DAA had proper equipment to continue to provide administrative support to the Department and worked with 3rd floor DAA's to discuss possible coverage. DAA ensured signage in the office and her phone number were directed to contact her via email.
- Program Coordinators: Worked with program coordinators in the department to anticipate what administrative support coordinator needs would be needed in the immediate few weeks. Determined that all support for coordinators could be provided remotely.
- Faculty: Worked with faculty in the department to anticipate what possible support was needed to work remotely. Worked with DAA to provide faculty any necessary supplies to provide virtual instruction and/or work remotely.
- Students: Program coordinators communicated with students and kept them up to date on university communication and the implications to specific programs. HEAL program coordinator hosted a virtual check in with students to answer any questions and/or concerns from students. The P-12 coordinator kept faculty and students informed of COVID19 implications related to state credentialing.
- Contingency Plan: A contingency plan was developed in case the department chair became ill. Two KSOEHD department chair colleagues were identified to support the Educational Leadership Department in current chair's absence.

Department of Liberal Studies

There were no faculty searches in 2019-20. Given the anticipated financial state of the institution for the academic year 2020-21, it is not expected that any searches will occur. With increased enrollment in the South Valley Integrated Teacher Education Program and renewed interest in the Fresno State STEP Cohort model, we are exceeding our capacity for courses with tenure-track faculty. For fall 2020, there are five sections of the *LS 110WS: Writing in the K-8 Classroom* course scheduled. Dr. Selena Van Horn is the department faculty member who teaches this course, so the need for additional instructional faculty in the department is evident. We were sorry to see the departure in January of Dr. Adriana Cervantes-Gonzales, our District Liaison for the South Valley ITEP. Ms. Bernadette Vazquez, a retired teacher, and experienced Clinical Practice Coach is now fulfilling those vital communication and collaboration responsibilities well.

The Department realized the significant curricular achievements of the approval for the first capstone courses in Liberal Studies: *LS 115 - Understanding and Applying Social Science Content, Pedagogy, & Technology in K-12; and LS 120 - Community-Based Learning in STEM.* These innovative courses, developed by Dr. Patrick De Walt and Dr. Myunghwan Shin respectively, will provide high-impact and relevant learning experiences for Liberal Studies majors in their senior year. The Integrated Teacher Education Program proposal is at the Chancellor's Office for approval. We are in the development stage for a course focusing on *Literacies, Language, and Literature.* This course is carefully aligned with the content specifications for the Elementary Subject Matter Authorization from the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. We have also collaborated with Dr. Katherine Fobear in the Department of Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies in the development of a course in *Gender and Sexuality in Education.* This new course, upon approval by the Multicultural/International Subcommittee, will provide valuable additional capacity for Liberal Studies majors.

• COVID – 19 Response

The interruption of instruction due to the COVID-19 pandemic was met by Liberal Studies faculty with commitment and flexibility, with particular attention to the social and emotional needs of our students. We are especially proud of the culture of care and support that was made available to our students. Many faculty have applied to the Virtual Summer Institute for support in transforming previous face-to-face courses to virtual instruction.

Liberal Studies continues to exceed CSU goals for the Graduation Initiative 2025. Our achievements in each of the four areas (4-year First-Time Freshmen, 6-year First-Time Freshmen, 4-year Transfer, and 2-year Transfer) are well above both the Chancellor's Office goals and the University average.



Department of Literacy, Early, Bilingual and Special Education

In AY 2019-2020, the Literacy, Early, Bilingual and Special Education Department (LEBSE) included 19 tenure/tenure track faculty,8 full-time temporary lecturers, 26 part-time temporary, 1 FERP, 1 administrative assistant, and 3 student assistants. The student assistants are shared with the Curriculum and Instruction (C&I) department. This is in addition to the Interim Dean who has retreat rights within the department

Faculty in the department provide a variety of courses for the Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialist teaching credential programs, as well as for a number of graduate programs specifically housed in the department as well as for the Kremen School of Education and Human Development (KSOEHD). The graduate programs specifically housed in the department are Early Childhood, Multilingual Multicultural Education, Reading/Literacy, and Special Education. The faculty also support the pre-professional program courses for Liberal Studies majors and for the Chicano and Latin American Studies.

In addition, it is evident from the professional activities and achievements listed below that the faculty are committed to providing the highest level of teaching research, and service. They are critical scholars and strong activists for social justice and world change. Many actively collaborate with faculty in other departments as well as with local school district educators and administrators, and are involved in important local, national, and international educational endeavors.

- 1. Program Data
 - The department houses the fully online Master of Arts in Education with an option in Reading/Language Arts (RDGLA), the Master of Arts in Education with an option in Multilingual, Multicultural Education (MME), the Master of Arts in Early Childhood Education (ECE) and a Master of Arts in Special Education (SPED). During 2019-20, 21 students entered the RDGLA program, 15 entered the MME program, 18 entered the ECE program, and 35 entered the SPED program. In addition to the master's programs, the department also offers two, advanced certificates: Reading/Literary Leadership Specialist Credential and the Early Childhood Credential. In 2019, the Reading/Language Arts program scored in the top 20 Best Online Master's in Reading & Literacy by Best Colleges.
 - In 2019-20, 202 students were admitted to the Multiple Subject (MS) credential program, 179 to the Single Subject credential program, 58 to the Educational Specialist (SPED) program, and 32 to the Dual (MS+SPED) program, for a total of 471 new credential students served by the LEBSE Department, in addition to hundreds of graduate students and prospective teaching candidates. Although retention is high in the credential, graduate, and advanced certificate programs, the number of teaching candidates across all programs except for the Dual program dipped this year from the 2018-19 total of 512. However, it is anticipated that enrollment will increase this coming fall, in part due to our seven new teacher residency programs coming onboard this year.

2. Fundraising

- Even though indirect funds from faculty grants are a minor source of support for faculty, fundraising in general is not a department effort. Funds are generally raised for the benefit of the Kremen School by the Director of Development in partnership with the Dean's Office, which maintains a centralized budget for the Kremen School.
- 3. 2019 Workplace Quality Survey
 - The survey showed that perceptions of senior leadership, communication, collaboration, and fairness ranked very low among the LEBSE faculty. As (interim) department chair, elected this year, I made an honest effort to implement university policies with fairness. The department tackled the 2019 workplace issues during its department meetings and worked closely with its counter department (C&I) to ensure equity and fairness on course scheduling and the hiring of faculty across both departments.
 - To increase communication, the department instituted an electronic department calendar and increased it use of the LEBSE Department Team Drive. The team drive contains university documents, Kremen documents, and monthly departmental meeting documents. It also includes interactive meeting agendas with links and references to numerous related documents. Each monthly meeting agenda contains a number of Reminders, Announcements, and Updates/Information (including faculty/staff news and recognitions) along with the New and Unfinished Business agenda items to serve as an informative resource for departmental faculty.
 - This year, the Course Classification System was a topic of concern and discussion within and across departments. The decision to set class caps at the normal class size for Fall 2020 was a consultative process. Faculty were also given the choice of increasing their class cap enrollment to allow for additional enrollees or to give out individual permission numbers.
- 4. COVID-19
 - During the week of March 16, 2020, all faculty were required to convert all face-to-face classes to a virtual format due to the COVID-19 global pandemic. The LEBSE Faculty worked tirelessly to convert their face-to-face courses to online. Faculty who were not online certified during 2019-20 were encouraged to register for the online training sessions. During the following two months, the faculty attended numerous virtual meetings to discuss the policy modifications for the campus, school, and credential requirements. The LEBSE Team Drive became the central point for documents providing guidance from the state and university for COVID-19. The school's peer evaluation form was revised to include the COVID-19 description paragraph. The LEBSE Department meetings for April and May 2020 were virtually held. In May 2020, the department administrative assistant mailed out honor and program colored codes to all who graduated with distinction during 2019-20. In addition, all four LEBSE graduate programs held virtual graduation celebrations and created virtual congratulatory videos in honor of their graduates.
- 5. Searches and Retirements
 - In August 2019, the department welcomed a Special Education Professor, Michael Mahoney. In May 2019, Dr. Colleen Torgerson (Special Education) fully retired, and in

May 2020, Dr. Dana Powell (Special Education) retired and will FERP in the fall of 2020.
